Cutting

Patch A:

From medium fabric:

Cut 2 (3 7/8" x 3 7/8") squares.

Cut on the diagonal once.

Patch B:

From light fabric:

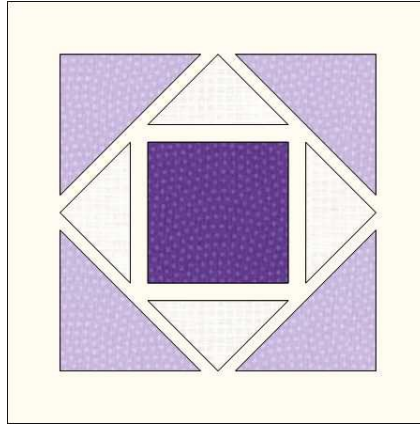
Cut 1 (4 3/16" x 4 3/16") square.

Cut on the diagonal twice.

Patch C:

From dark fabric:

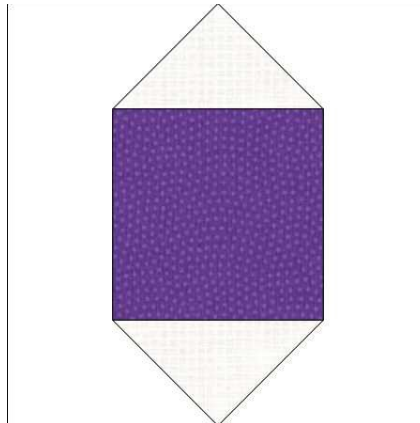
Cut 1 (3 1/2" x 3 1/2") square.



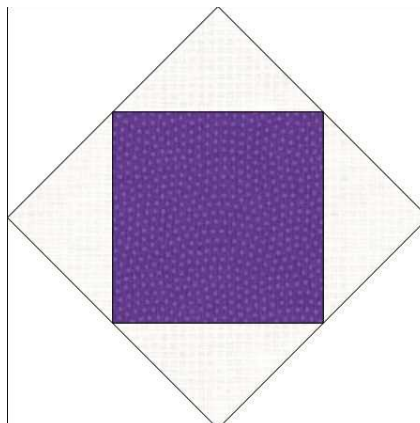
Joining block

1. Join the long side of Patch B to one side of Patch C. Press seams open.

2. Join the long side of Patch B to the opposite side of Patch C. Press seams open.



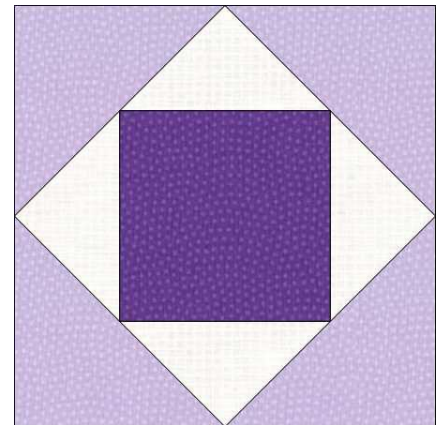
3. Join two remaining Patch B's to C. Press seams open.



4. Join the long side of Patch A to the newly formed BC unit. Press seams open.

5. Join the long side of Patch A to the opposite side on BC unit.

6. Join the two remaining Patch A's to the BC unit and press seams open.

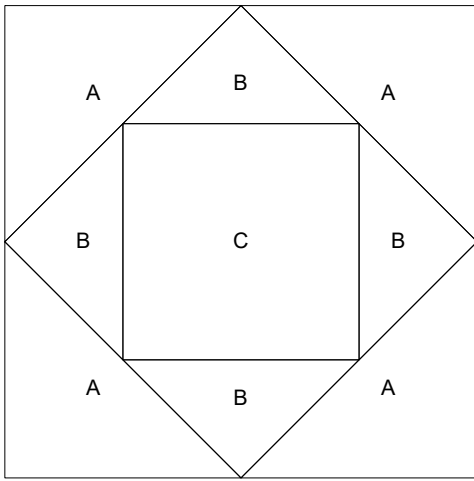

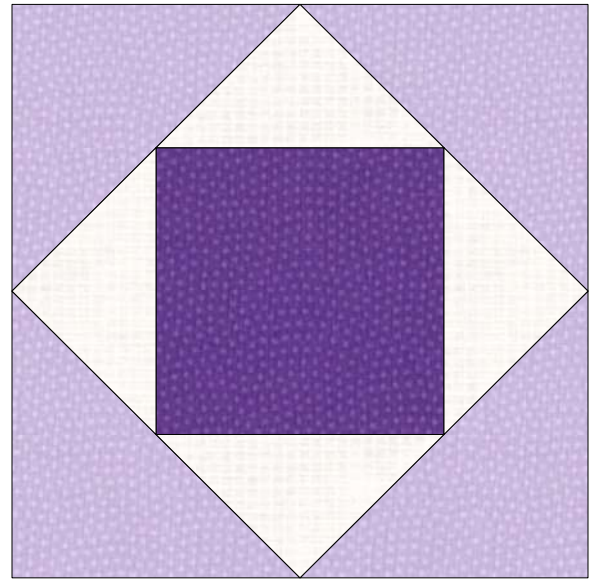
To keep triangle from getting wonky press down with your iron, instead of sliding it back and forth.

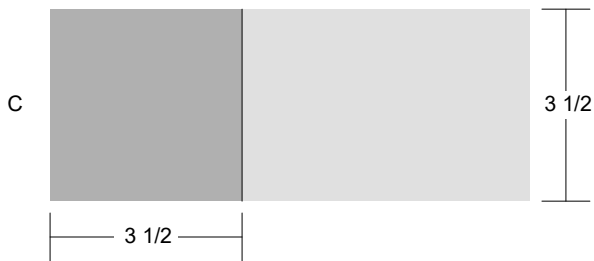
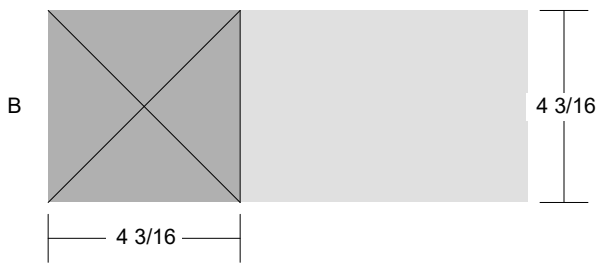
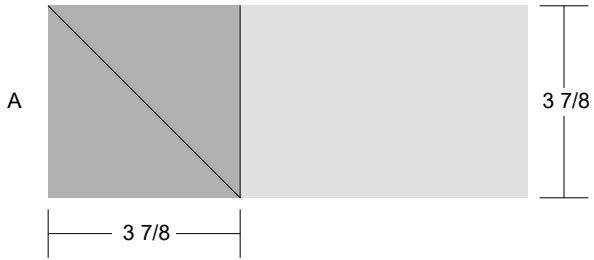
Key Block (41/100 actual size)



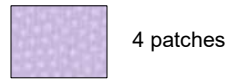
Cutting diagram
